2023-24**

Bendle Public Schools will continue to implement all necessary processes and procedures to provide in-person learning within a safe environment. This “Continuity of Services Plan” provides guidance to ensure COVID-19 prevention and mitigation measures are implemented with the goal of providing consistent educational opportunities and minimizing viral spread. This plan is developed in conjunction with guidance from the CDC, Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, Genesee County Health Department, and Bendle Public Schools Board of Education.

*This plan is subject to change based upon recommended and, or mandated changes from governmental agencies, as well as local metrics. This includes local outbreaks, potential variants, risk of severe disease, hospitalizations, and increased risk of death.*

<b>STUDENT ILLNESS</b>		
Stakeholders are asked to comply with Board Policy 8450-Control of Casual Contact Communicable Diseases. Students exhibiting the following symptoms new, different , or worse from their baseline of any chronic illness shall remain home or excluded from school until the student is symptom free for (24) hours without the aid of medication, or as indicated for their illness.
